Well over 1,000 bells rang for peace across Europe already in 2018 and 2019. This powerful eperience connected individuals and institutions across all European borders.

On Friday, May 9, 2025 – Europe Day – it is once again time: At 6:00 PM, we want to renew the "Europe Rings for Peace" initiative.

Starting from Chemnitz, the European Capital of Culture, bells will ring together with former and new participants, as well as the second European Capital of Culture Nova Gorica (Slovenia) and Gorizia (Italy), to create an intense and unifying experience and a reminder of peace.

In Chemnitz, a special focus will be placed on this event by integrating the Peace Ringing into the European Week of the Capital of Culture program on Friday, May 9, 2025, at 6:00 PM

All participants will perform the Peace Ringing independently at their respective locations, according to the local possibilities.
